THE MODEL ORGAN METHOD.

By Geo. F. Root.
A new book for the Reed organ, by the most successful of all writers for that instrument. Mr. Root considered that, although his first book was so successful, another one adapted to and embodying the advanced ideas was wanted, and the Model Organ Method is the result.
The work strikes one as symmetrical and complete. Beginning at the very beginning, it leads, by almost imperceptible degrees of increase in difficulty and by means of really beautiful music, to such attainments as qualify one for playing tastefully and well, church music accompaniments and organ solos of medium difficulty, and to begin, if desirable, the study of the large pipe organ. Such a course occupies half of the book, the remainder being filled with a remarkable collection of music—thoroughly practicable for players of the usual attainments, pieces the right length for church use, and always attractive musically. The songs of the book will be found up to the standard in other departments; the typography is fine, and altogether its publishers feel justified in calling unusual attention to the work.
